Principals Report to the PSL AGM 16 June 2021

As a team you really pulled together and fundraised for something extraordinary.

In 2020 our PSL, supported by our school community, banded together to raise funds for a new play area. Our community worked hard to meet our set goals. This helped us re-build our community after covid for our common good -we had something to look forward to and work towards for our tamariki/our community. This had an amazing effect and created a real buzz amongst our learners, and whanau.

We had some very generous whanau and community sponsors as well as some significant donors (LTMcGuinness Ltd and Placemakers Lyall Bay) who donated items and time which meant that we were able to take action and produce an immediate outcome...this equaled fun! I acknowledge that this priority list is large. However it highlights out my earlier comments that having an active and successful PSL is essential for the school.

In closing, I would like to reflect on the following. Living in modern society is busy, there are strong demands from employers, there are family priorities, and many people are time poor. We are aware of the reduced support for PSL in the last few years which could have been caused, at least in part by these factors. However last year we saw how a big child centred project got our community engaged and also created a climate of 'true community'. As a way of rejuvenating PSL, some skilful whanau could be recruited to continue to help with a refresh of the image of PSL and a drive to establish a much stronger membership base going forward. This could include an enhanced way of communicating with new whanau and a personal invitation when they enrol their tamariki. Let's get another 'BIG' project happening.
